From what we understand, issues with technology and with the details of parts of the scheme have not helped Natural England in its efforts to give clear guidance to its own advisors and directly to scheme applicants.

Stable Isotope Ratio Analysis

There has been a recent development with some retailers, within their current due diligence protocols, investigating the use of Stable Isotope Ratio Analysis to determine whether a product has been grown to organic production principles.

OF&G currently has serious reservations regarding the use of this as a stand alone test. That is not to question the science necessarily but more whether the quality and quantity of data used in the interpretation of a result is sufficiently robust to determine whether a result conforms to certain stated tolerances or not.

OF&G believe that significant work needs to be undertaken to understand the influences on this test and to build up a sufficiently extensive database that reflects the complexity and variances within the supply chain before we can truly state that the test is substantive. OF&G ask that those in support of this development undertake this necessary work after which we feel we can then review whether this test is sufficiently robust to fall within the scope of the current regulatory framework.

This development does raise concerns that this test could be seen as a 'silver bullet' by those that do not understand the principles of organic farming and food production and that it takes us away from the essence of what we are trying to deliver in terms of a whole system approach to sustainable food production incorporating the highest animal welfare and key environment goals

As a consequence of these concerns we do not consider it, in itself, to demonstrate a substantiated suspicion and as such, within the regulatory framework, does not offer a basis for investigation.

This has been under discussion within all the UK CB's and all are currently in agreement that this test alone does not amount to a substantive suspicion. OF&G are currently in dialogue with Defra on this issue.

Reminder of 5% samples and 10% additional/unannounced visits

In 2013 OF&G and Defra were audited by the Food and Veterinary Office (FVO) of the European Commission, the reason for the audit was to check that the organic control system in the UK is working effectively and all parts of the system are acting as they should. The FVO and the European Court of Auditors visited a number of EU countries and as a result the European Commission introduced some new standards relating to inspections and sampling of products.

From the 1st January 2014 OF&G have been required to undertake the normal annual inspection of all of our licensees, we will also have to undertake an extra visit/inspection on 10% of our licensees. On top of this requirement we have to undertake an unannounced inspection on 10% of the total number of annual inspections and the additional visits/inspections combined, these unannounced inspections could either be an additional inspection or your annual inspection. You may also find that we take a sample of your products for testing as we are also now required to take and test a sample from 5% of our licensees.

OLMC – Organic Livestock Trends

A new year of challenges lie ahead for the farming community, especially those who continue to experience flooding in the west and north of the UK. Levels of price and demand for finished stock provide another challenge, especially in the month of January when retail sales of all meats are traditionally slow. Colder weather, when it arrives, could help to boost sales of beef and lamb as the population gets back to eating habits more akin to the season.

The lead up to Christmas was fairly uneventful with little bounce in demand or trade. All stock has finished well which has allowed a steady flow to come forward to meet the abattoirs needs.

The organic cull cow trade has remained quiet, with average volume in demand being comfortably met. Although we have seen a slight increase in price this last week, the organic prime beef trade continues to be slow with cattle numbers very similar to the run up to Christmas. A positive turn in the trade could be triggered if the weather changes dramatically and numbers tighten up.

However, quality and weight has been very good through the autumn period with many producers seeing higher average weights and better conformation and finish in their cattle than in past years.

The trade for organic lambs has improved since the beginning of the autumn. Lambs have had few challenges and have moved to finish quickly. The demand has improved also. This increase in demand has led to an increase in price.

So far many producers have finished lambs off the grass, but dietary needs will need to be addressed as soon as we see the weather come colder in order for the lambs to continue finishing well.

Demand for organic store cattle has improved over the past few weeks with finishers saying that their finished cattle are coming forward earlier than previous years due to the quality and quantity of winter feed encouraging many of them to look for replacements. As always, quality beef cross stores of heavier weight are fetching premium money but additional markets are appearing giving opportunity for other weights and grades.

Producers

Statutory Instrument

For many years now Defra, as the Competent Authority in the UK, have delegated a number of tasks to the organic Control Bodies. These tasks included approving derogations such as the use of non-organic poultry under three days of age or 'part-organic' pullets for egg production etc. During a number of recent Food and Veterinary Office (FVO) audits Defra has been informed that they are no longer able to delegate such tasks and Defra must take these back in hand. In order to make the process as smooth as possible for OF&G licensees and not add

unnecessary time to applications for non-organic products, we have been working closely with Defra to find a practical solution. It has been agreed that routine tasks such as:

- tail docking of lambs;
- disbudding of calves;
- dehorning of cattle;
- the use of vegetative propagating material,

can be approved by the control body. This is the normal procedure that OF&G licensees will be familiar with. Once the approval has been granted OF&G will be required to inform Defra of the approval, which is a new addition to the process.

However, in order to approve the use of the following, the approval must be requested prior to the non-organic animals or non-organic feed material being purchased. Defra will not be able to give approval if you have already purchased or brought in these products:

- **non-organic day old chicks;**
- **part-organic pullets for egg production;**
- **brought in non-organic animals up to 40%;**
- **non-organic feed and/or livestock due to catastrophic circumstances;**
- **synthetic vitamins A, D or E in the diet of ruminants,**

The completed copy of the relevant OF&G Record Sheet shall be used and this will be sent to Defra in order that they can assess the approval request. To speed the process up we will need as much information regarding the circumstances of the approval as possible.

Reminder grass/forage mix organic percentage and definition of a forage mix

For the previous two years the minimum percentage inclusion of organic seed in a grass and/or forage seed mixture has been set at 70%. Since the introduction of the percentage approach in the early 2000's the organic inclusion rate has been steadily increasing to the current rate of 70%. The organic grass seed working group have not met to discuss an increase in the percentage during 2015 and we have not received representation from Defra of any increase.

As a result the percentage inclusion of organic seed will remain at 70% for 2016.

Please note the following:

- The same variety of seed may not be used in both organic and non-organic form within the mix;
- For a seed mix to be categorised as such it must be a mix prior to the point of sowing;
- You will still need to complete and return the Seed Approval form (Record Sheet 4a from your Organic Standards and Certification Manual) PRIOR TO YOUR NEXT INSPECTION.

Processors

Artwork for approval

Please ensure that all draft, and any amended, organic artworks (labels etc) are submitted to OF&G, along with confirmation of the EU logo dimensions, prior to printing, for stamped approval.

Once the artworks have been approved by a processing certification officer a stamped 'approved copy' of the artwork will be forwarded to you as proof of approval by OF&G.
