National Organic Combinable Crops 2016



NOCC16 Farm Walk

Organic farmers and growers were given plenty of reasons to be cheerful at this year's National Organic Combinable Crops conference, the largest on-farm event in the sector's calendar.

Increasing demand for organic food and changes in consumer shopping habits mean there are greater business opportunities available for farmers than ever before, experts from the sector revealed.

Over 200 delegates from across the supply chain gathered at the National Trust's Wimpole Estate to hear that farmers should feel confident about investing in organic production, provided they understand their market and where opportunities for growth lie.

During a presentation session chaired by Farming Today and Countryfile presenter Charlotte Smith, Paul Moore of the Organic Trade Board said despite having a 'bumpy ride' in recent years, there were strong reasons for optimism in the sector.

In addition to growing global demand for organic produce, a new generation of shoppers in the organic sector had emerged, who brought fresh opportunities for producers in the sector.

And with global organic sales now worth about €50bn, and European sales accounting for a third of that, growers had to have confidence that the long-term consumer trends would continue to help the sector, he said.

Andrew Saunders, chair of the Waitrose Farming Partnership, said the challenge now for the sector was to address issues of availability, which meant encouraging more producers to convert to organic and ensuring growers responded to consumer demand.

With Waitrose accounting for 25% of total organic sales in the UK, he said the retailer was keen to work collaboratively with UK growers to shorten supply chains, limit risk, and ensure demand is met.

As usual, visitors took part in a farm walk, which this year gave them an insight into the National Trust's largest

organic farm, managed by Richard Morris.

"I think it's a very exciting day. Lots of things for people to look at. Real life with organics is that we have some problems that we have to deal with, it's about learning which is why I've been open about inviting NOCC here."

Delegates were also treated to a fantastic meal of organic lamb, sourced from Wimpole's flock of rare-breed white-faced woodland sheep, which accounts for 10% of the national flock. And as usual, there were also supplies of delicious organic cakes and breads.

New crop Organic farm gate prices have seen some support recently as import prices have been lifted sharply following much weaker sterling rates against both the dollar and euro. We feel that consumer buyers have the bulk of their cereal requirement still to purchase, but are reluctant to pay higher values in the short term as this would be inflationary to their autumn finished feed prices. The market needs a little time to settle following the volatility of recent events, and the wider implications of any positive/negative effect of the Brexit process on the UK economy are seen. It seems that formal withdrawal from the EU will take some time, so we hope for business as usual in the meantime...keep close to your buyer!

There will be some selling pressure from those who require quick collection as harvest gets underway, but we think prices should remain steady until other origin offers are seen, so buyers can then make decisions regarding their feed ingredients. The weak sentiment in the non Organic market (which remains oversupplied with feed grade wheat) can act as a drag to our premium market, but the orderly (or otherwise) supply of Organic raw materials will be key to price direction in our marketplace. We expect strong demand will continue for any quality domestic samples following the indifferent weather seen during June, so representative samples will be gratefully received post harvest.

Organic Livestock Trends: OLMC

Trade for finished cattle has seen its position solidify over the last few weeks thanks to a definite shortage in numbers coming forward. Consumer demand remains largely unchanged but we could see that alter if the warm Summer weather continues for any length of time.

In addition, these changeable weather conditions have caused frustration for farmers trying to catch grass crops, while there is an abundance of grass the weather seems to close in before it can be harvested. Although there is plenty of grass to be cut, the quality of it might be of more concern due to it not being cut at optimum times.

The organic cull cow trade continues to be strong and prices have improved, supplies again have shortened with an indication that the price will need to move in a positive manner to secure what supplies there are.

Regarding finished lambs, although the weather has been so changeable most producers are reporting good growth rates with a plentiful supply coming forward for the abattoirs. However, it is likely that due to the inclement conditions there will be an

increasing number of lambs becoming ready at the same time, which can cause a backlog in the system. It is therefore, very important that you forecast and plan your likely numbers to try to minimise the inevitable downward movement in the market.

The uplift in finished store stock prices, the massive forage crops and the renewed confidence has meant organic store cattle have sold well over the last two months. Going forward into the Autumn we have a number of Finishers requiring stock so added supplies of store stock will be required. Prices of store cattle have crept up in line with the better returns from finished cattle. We have seen a 10 – 15 pence lift in prices across all categories of organic store cattle. Looking ahead, the supply of organic store cattle is bound to decline and with that in mind it may be worth considering buying breeding cows to produce stores to sell or finish.

Technical News

Unannounced inspections

You may have found an inspector turn up on your premises to complete an inspection without any prior warning and we have been asked a few times now why this is the case? As part of our statutory requirements within the organic regulation OF&G has to undertake a number of additional visits of our operators, it also requires that the majority of these are unannounced. In addition to this we are also expected to undertake a proportion of the Annual Inspections as unannounced inspections.

So what is an unannounced inspection? According to Defra and the European Food & Veterinary Office, an unannounced inspection is as stated and should be conducted without giving any notice to the operator. However, they do understand that in exceptional circumstances where the safety of the operator and the inspector could be compromised as a result, such as where livestock are involved, some discretion can be afforded to the inspector.

As a consequence, however, you could find if you haven't already had one, that your next inspection may be unannounced.

Producers

Amending Regulation 673/2016

The European Commission have recently published an amendment to the organic regulation, Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2016/673 was published at the end of April 2016. The new regulation includes some changes to the aquaculture standards and the use of non-organic animals due to catastrophic circumstances. However, the main changes have been to amend the lists of products that are permitted to be used in organic systems be it as field inputs or as part of livestock production. The majority of the changes to the lists have been to tidy-up the conditions of use for certain products and bring these in line with other legislation. It has also introduced a number of new substances that would previously not have been allowed on an organic farm.

The main one being the inclusion of products known as basic substances. These may not be used as herbicides but can be used to control pests and diseases in organic crops. For a copy of the published regulation visit the following web site:

Approvals/Statutory Instrument

The new requirements for applying for, and approving, certain practices have been in place now for over six months. Nevertheless as the process is still relatively new we thought it timely to remind everyone of what is involved when applying to undertake operations such as bringing in non-organic poultry under three days of age or 'part-organic' pullets for egg production etc. Defra are no longer able to delegate such tasks and have taken these back in hand.

In order to make the process as smooth as possible for licensees and not add unnecessary time to applications for non-organic products, we have been working closely with Defra to find a practical solution. It has been agreed that routine tasks such as:

- tail docking of lambs;
- disbudding of calves;
- dehorning of cattle;
- the use of vegetative propagating material,

can be approved by the control body, as long as the control body informs Defra of the approvals that have been granted.

You will need to apply for approval to undertake these operations in the normal way or this will be picked up by the inspector at your annual inspection. If you are undertaking any of the above operations on farm you must ensure this is written and justified in your animal health plans.

The following requests now need PRIOR approval from Defra.

- **non-organic day old chicks;**
- **part-organic pullets for egg production;**

- **brought in non-organic animals up to 40%;**
- **non-organic feed and/or livestock due to catastrophic circumstances;**
- **synthetic vitamins A, D or E in the diet of ruminants.**

Do not purchase these until you have an approval in place.

Complete the relevant application form and forward it to your certification officer, who will seek approval from Defra. This is an additional step that will add time to the approvals process. To speed the process up we will need as much information regarding the circumstances of the approval request from YOU as soon as possible.

Decertified Organic Salmon Supplier

The organic licence for Ocean Farms Ltd (Donegal Road, Killybegs, Co. Donegal, Ireland) was suspended due to the detection of oxytetracycline residues above the Maximum Residue Limit (MRL) of 100ug/kg. A total of 134,761.84 kgs of organic salmon has been affected by this detection. The Control Body (Global Trust) instructed Oceans Farms Ltd to withdraw the affected batched from market.

The investigation into the detection of oxytetracycline residues has now been completed by the Control Body (Organic Trust) and the suspension was lifted following clear results on the 30th June 2016.

If you have any questions regarding a supply of salmon from Oceans Farms Ltd, please contact your certification officer. If there are any further updates with regards to this issue information will be made available to licensees.

Fraudulent Organic Certificate

A fraudulent organic certificate has been identified for the company EUR Sarl Afoul Ltd with the address Rue de la Seigliere 33800 Bordeaux France and certificate number 16-508.

The certificate has been produced to represent an organic certificate issued by the Control Body Pacific Agricultural Certification Society (PACS).

The certificate details that the processes covered are production, handling, packing, storage and distribution of beans and pulses.

If you are unsure about any supplier certificates, please forward a copy of the certificate to OF&G. Note: All new supplier certificates must be submitted to OF&G prior to the purchase of products.

Additional controls for imported organic products

Please note that there are additional requirements when importing products from Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Moldova, Tajikistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan and Russia.

When products are imported from the above third countries, these imports must be positively identified to the Port Health Authority and samples must be taken at the point of entry into the UK and testing to ensure the products comply with the requirements for organic products.

Artwork Approval

Please ensure that all new and amended organic artworks (labels etc) are submitted to OF&G for approval prior to printing, along with confirmation of the EU logo dimensions in mm. Drafts can be submitted in pdf format via email.

Once the artworks have been approved by a processing certification officer, a stamped 'approved copy' of the artwork will be forwarded to you as proof of the approval by OF&G.

Please note that if stamped approval has not been given by OF&G prior to printing, and the artwork does not comply with the organic labelling regulations, it cannot be used and new artwork will be required.

Fogging

If any spraying, fumigation or fogging is to be undertaken the MSDS and product information for the product(s) to be used must be submitted to OF&G for review to ensure that all the organic requirements are met prior to use.

During this process all organic goods and packaging must be removed.

Please ensure three times the recommended dispersal time is allowed before organic goods and packaging are returned to the treated areas and that the dispersal times for fogging are recorded.

Use of steviol glycosides in a <95% organic product approved by Defra

OF&G has received a number of enquiries regarding the use of stevia based ingredients in their organic products.

Stevia is a high intensity sweetener with a low glycaemic index making it an attractive alternative to sugar. It is available as stevia leaf extract or the more purified form, steviol glycosides (E960).

Following these enquiries OF&G asked Defra for clarification on the use of steviol glycosides in organic food. After much consideration Defra approved the use of steviol glycosides **"as a non-organic ingredient in a product of less than 95% organic content."**

Products with <95% organic agricultural ingredients **cannot** use the EU logo and can only reference 'organic' in the ingredient list. The quantity of organic ingredients as a percentage of the total agricultural ingredients must also be stated in the ingredient panel.

Please note, steviol glycosides are not permitted in organic products (i.e. products with >95% of organic agricultural ingredients).

In addition to complying with the organic regulations licensees are advised to contact their local trading Standards Officer or Local Authority to ensure they comply with statutory regulations.

Corrective actions following organic inspections

Please note that corrective actions must be submitted to the **OF&G office** for review following your organic inspection.
